Non stinky dish cloths? Is it possible?

Our kitchen sees plenty of action as it is here where we prepare and cook our meals.

The aftermath of all the cooking means plenty of dishes to be washed and stored away with the counters wiped down to remove any food debris. Usually, I recycle any excess cloth in my home or just purchase regular sponges, but I noticed that they tend to reek after a while.

No matter how many times I rinse them under running water, I always end up with stinky dish rags! Although I did not have the same issue with the sponges, I read that since sponges take a while before they dry, germs tend to accumulate on them.

How horrible!

Just imagine having to wipe the counters where I prepare my food with these two. Think of all the germs I've been spreading without my knowledge.

After encountering this problem several times, I decided to look for an alternative cleaning tool that brought me to non stinky dish cloths. How will they fare? Here's what I found out.

Dish Cloths vs Sponges

Cotton dish cloths are often used for cleaning kitchen counters because they tend to be soft and non-scratching. I admit that these are my go-to cleaning tools because I can simply wash it afterwards. The only problem is that after several uses, I end up with smelly dish rags.

On a good note, I learned how to <u>get rid of the smell</u> by putting all my dirty dish cloths in a large pot filled with water, half a cup of vinegar, and a teaspoon or two of my liquid dish soap then bringing it to a boil. You have to stir the pot from time to time then drain afterwards.

Sponges, on the other hand, do a decent job of removing the tough food stains if they give them a good scrub. However, I don't dry them properly which means that they have become a hotbed for germs, molds, and other bacteria.

Experts recommend that if you are going to use one to clean your kitchen, better pop your damp sponge in the microwave for a minute to eliminate all the bacteria. Sounds good!

Why Non Stinky Dish Cloths are Better

If cotton dish cloths and sponges aren't exactly great for cleaning, what can you use? I have tried various products already in search of best dish cloths, and one stood out which is the All-Purpose Dish Cloth from The Crown Choice. Here's what I love about it.

Odor-Free Dishcloths

Sponges and dish cloths often smell bad after a while because of the buildup of bacteria, but the non stinky dish cloths from The Crown Choice are smell-free. This is because the material used is non-absorbent meaning that bacteria will not be able to accumulate. Also, it tends to dry up quickly which is another reason why it doesn't smell after several uses.

Non-Scratch Design

Another reason why I enjoy using this all-purpose dish cloth is that it has a non-scratch design. I have used it on various materials like cast iron, plastic, and porcelain even and I did not see any damage to them.

Upon closer inspection, I realized that what makes this dish cloth effective in cleaning without becoming smelly is that it has soft bristles that can help loosen up any debris without being too rough.

Versatile

I like that non stinky dish cloths like Versatile is not limited to cleaning my pots, pans, and counters, because I have practically used it everywhere. I am more confident with the way I scrub and scour tough dirt around my home with it.

What we like:

- ✓ Soft bristles clean efficiently without scratching the surface.
- ✓ Dries quickly which stops mold and bacteria from accumulating.
- ✓ Durable and doesn't fray even with repeated use.

What we don't like:

- ★ Not made for sopping up spilled liquid.
- imes A customer noticed that it had a smell after some use.
- ★ Another user complained that it left a stain on their cookware.

Best Odor Free Dish Cloths

I have also checked others to see which ones can be used in my kitchen. So far, these are among the best that I have tried and tested.

The Crown Choice All-Purpose Dish Cloth

Again, this is by far one of the best non stinky dish cloths products that I have tested for cleaning my kitchen. It is odor-free, because it dries up quickly, and it won't scratch any surface that you are going to use it with.

What we like:

- \checkmark Soft bristles are built to remove stubborn debris on cookware and counters
- ✔Gentle enough to be used on all kinds of materials.
- ✓ Food can be flushed from the dish scrubber with ease.

What we don't like:

Not ideal for cleaning up spills.Possible staining on certain types of materials.

Lunatec Odor-free Dishcloths

Lunatec's odor-free dishcloths have fewer bacteria in it compared to cotton-based dishcloths and sponges. They are easy to clean and offer versatility too because they can be used to clean other surfaces.

What we like:

- ✔ Remain odor-free after several uses.
- ✓ Any debris rinses easily.
- ✓ Scrubbing works well in removing tough buildup.

What we don't like:

- ★ Not absorbent and can't clean messes
- ★ Bigger and tougher to handle.
- imes A customer had a hard time rinsing food debris on it.

Swedish Dishcloth Cellulose Sponge Cloths

Another option to consider for the best kitchen dishcloths is the cellulose sponge cloth by Swedish Dishcloth.

What I like about this product is that it mixes a cellulose sponge with a traditional teatowel. It is soft to handle when it is wet and effective in scrubbing when dry. There are no odors to worry about too.

What we like:

✓ A reviewer loved the combination of cellulose sponge and tea-towel for cleaning.

- ✓ Perfect for cleaning all surfaces.
- ✓ Affordable and can be used for months.

What we don't like:

- imes A bit thinner compared to other dishcloths.
- ★ A reviewer did not like that this dishcloth is not absorbent.

★ You will have to rinse and wring the cloth thoroughly as it leaves more water residues on the surface.

Whiff Bamboo Dish Cloth & Kitchen Wipe

This two-ply bamboo dish cloth is another alternative to consider as it combines scrubbing power and high absorption rate in one product. It is an eco-friendly cleaning solution that can handle tough messes in the kitchen.

What we like:

✓ It is environment-friendly.
✓ Material is easy to wash and maintain.
✓ Odor and bacteria free.

What we don't like:

Customers noticed that it leaves streaks on the counter when cleaning.Another reviewer complained that it had a smell to it especially when wet.

Easy Theory Free of Odor, Stain, and Grease Dish Cloths

This soft and absorbent dishcloth can handle light to heavy cleaning in the kitchen. Rinsing it with warm water is enough for cleaning up light stains, but add more soap or liquid cleaner for heavy cleaning. Fabric is tough and odor-free.

What we like:

✔Grease, stain, and odor free.
✔Ideal for cleaning all kinds of surfaces both in and outside the kitchen.
✔Fabric is thick and durable and will not fray easily.

What we don't like:

Doesn't work well for scrubbing purposes.
Some customers noticed that the fabric does give off a smell after a few days of use.
Needs to be wringed out thoroughly to remove excess water.

If you are tired of having to deal with dish cloths that smell as I do, I highly recommend that you get The Crown Choice's All-Purpose Dish Cloth. Aside from being odorless, <u>it is a versatile dish cloth that can be used for all kinds of surfaces</u>. A perfect addition to any kitchen!
